Community Projects 2014

The members of the guild continue to provide quilts for those in need by donating supplies and finished quilts, tops, and quilting in support of the following charities:

- **CHEO Oncology** Summer 2013, 20 quilts were delivered to CHEO in the summer. In December 2013, 20 more quilts were delivered;
- **Kidney Foundation** March 2013, a delivery of 6 quilts was made to the Kidney Foundation for distribution to the children on dialysis at CHEO;
- **Chernobyl, Belarus** 97 quilts from our guild plus 10 from the Ottawa Valley Guild were sent via Mary Bernard of Brockville for use in the orphanages and affected communities;
- Cuddle Quilts Barbara Donaldson oversees the distribution of supplies and the collection of the quilts to be given to the Ottawa Hospital General Campus at risk babies. 383 quilts were given between February 2012 and January 2013. Catherine Patterson delivers them;
- Eastern Ottawa Resource Centre (EORC) This year, 29 quilts have been delivered for use by their Victims of Violence and Mental Health clients; 42 walker pouches were given in March 2013.
- **Interval House** Summer 2013, 18 quilts were delivered for the women and children sheltered there; 10 quilts were delivered in January 2014.

Thank you to the generous members of the Common Thread Quilt Guild who make all this giving possible!

Both had a great day quilting with the ladies and talking (and having their picture taken) by the visitors.
