Quilt Show Registration

- 1. The deadline for submitting quilt show entries is April 8th.
- 2. A separate Registration Form must be completed for each item and sent electronically, mailed with a post mark no later than April 8th, or handed in to the Registrar at the Guild meeting, along with a colour photograph of the item. It is not necessary for the item to be finished by April

8th as long as the photo shows enough of the item that it can be identified from the photo. If you have submitted the registration form electronically and did not use the digital signature option, please stop by the registration table at the meeting to sign the form(s).

- 3. For each entry you will receive a clear plastic bag in which to put your quilt and a Quilt Identification Form to be put in the bag with your quilt. This form can also be downloaded from the website.
- 4. The information regarding drop-off locations will be available at the April Guild meeting.
- 5. New members' (since Jan. 1, 2014) quilts are welcome, but are ineligible for prizes.



CUDDLE QUILTS CLARIFICATION

Here are the answers to some frequently asked questions about the Cuddle Quilts

- * Cuddle Quilts (22" x 22") are given to the Neo Natal Unit at the General Hospital.
- * Our target: 350 (September- June) We regularly exceed our target!
- * A cuddle Quilt does NOT require a flannel back- use cotton if you like. It does NOT require any specific batting: use cotton OR polyester OR a combination batting.
- * A Cuddle Quilt DOES require a label. Ask for them at the table to the right of the stage. If you bring in an un-labeled quit, we will provide you with a needle and thread to sew it on as the quilts are delivered directly from the meeting.
- * We do not record names when quilts are turned in or when we give out the batts and backs,
- * To help the work along, the Community Projects committee provides 12 pre-cut batts per month and 12-30 pre-cut flannel backs.
- * Some flannel has been donated and some has been purchased by the CP Committee. We budget for one bolt of purchased batting per year just for Cuddle Quilts.
- * We request that a Guild member pick up a maximum of two batts and four backs per month- 20 batts and 40 backs per year. In this way, we hope to give as many members as possible a chance to participate in this Guild funded exercise.

- * At the end of the meeting, a member can add to this allotment by taking any remaining batts or backs.
- * Donate as many quilts as you like. Our precut items are only a convenience and are not meant to limit your generosity.

INCH COLLECTOR REPORT


As I write this, spring has officially arrived but the weather apparently did not get the memo! The Rideau Canal Skateway has been closed for the season but





Cut from 80x80 soft, color fast, pre-shrunk percale in 10 blended rainbow tints set in this order: apple green, lime, buttercup, pink, light rose, ruby, rose, light rose, lilac, lavender, seaspray blue. Add your fillin blocks and borders for finished size of about 83" square. You get the 288 diamonds for the star, directions, color diagram and quilting pattern. Only \$4.89 in stores or order ppd. (No C.O.D.'s—money back if not satisfied) from Aunt Martha's Studios, Dept. W711, 1243 Swift, Kansas City 16, Mo.

By the way, 'percale' describes the weave of the fabric, at least a 200/" thread count but not the fabric content.
