All the quilts





We have some new books for this month. The number appearing in brackets is the inventory number.

Ouilt As-You-Go Made Modern by Iera Brandvig (697) gives directions for quilting blocks directly onto batting pieces. Since you guilt on smaller pieces and then join them it is very manageable. There are lots of ideas for improvised blocks and for traditional blocks as well. After joining the blocks, the backing is put on as one large piece and quilted lightly onto the front. Easy to put down for a while and return to. Looks like fun.

Shape by Shape: Free-Motion Quilting with Angela Walters (695) has many designs for blocks, negative space and borders. The instructions are clear and there are many variations for the designs. Think Big by Amy Ellis (694) features 18" blocks some of which have a traditional look and some of which are modern. There are patterns for runners, pillows and quilts. Each pattern has instructions for five sizes; baby, throw, twin, queen and king. One block can make a pillow while a few in a row makes a runner.

Graphic Quilts from Everyday Images by Heather Schrimsher (696) has patterns inspired from urban life, architecture and nature. There are sections on enlarged details from photos, using blocks to play with details from a photo and finally a section on turning the lines in a photo to strips. Some examples are chain-link fence, masonry, stonework and a propeller. This book will have you looking more closely at the objects around you.

I hope you will enjoy these books as much as I enjoy buying them.
