
Facebook

In this work shop you will be learning the technique of quilting in sections by trying it vourself. This amazing technique will allow you to guilt large guilts on a regular household sewing machine. Three variations will be taught. Two of these techniques are done so that the finished guilt has no visible sign of being quilted in sections. Various guilts that have been guilted with these methods will be available to see. Other places that these applications could be used will also be explored. Handouts for further reference will be available. It is my hope that this workshop will be both fun and informative for you. Knowledge of machine guilting is a prerequisite.


