# **Outreach Recipients 2014-2015**

The Community Projects Committee collects donations of fabric, batting or thread and produces 4m kits of fabric to be sewn into tops or finished quilts by the membership. We provide labels to identify the quilts as a product of our guild. The quilts will be distributed to the following programs:

#### 1. Cuddle Quilts:

22" x 22". These are given monthly to the Neo-natal Intensive Care Unit at the General Hospital. They can be cotton or flannel or a mix. Please-no invisible thread. The Guild provides battings and backings cut to size. If you wish

to take up to three at a meeting, see Barbara Donaldson at the Community Projects table.

2. Interval House, Ottawa: 40" x 60" or smaller. Interval House is a place of refuge for abused women and their family. Quilts are used there as well as being taken by the family.

#### 3. CHEO Dialysis:

40" x 60". The recipients are on dialysis and/or awaiting a transplant. The ages range from 2-18.

#### 4. Chernobyl, Europe:

any size finished quilt. Tops: 40" x 60" or smaller. One Canadian's dedication to aiding the people of this poverty stricken area has resulted in 15 years of giving to orphans, the elderly, children and families.

#### **Victoria VanderLinden**

Quilts of every size and type are just one of the items sent with his shipment every spring.

# 5. Eastern Ottawa Resource Centre, Orleans:

40" x 60". The Centre uses our quilts as part of their programs for the elderly and for abused women.

#### 6. NEW! The Infant and child Development Program of Algoma Public Health, Ontario:

40" x 50". The Parent Child Advisors there deal with 130 cases a year of at risk infants and children experiencing delays in development. Think crib quilt.

# 7. NEW! Ronald McDonald House, Ottawa:

40" x 60" or smaller. Children from birth to the age of 18 who have to come to Ottawa for outpatient work through

CHEO can stay with their family here. The quilts will be given to the patients where it would be deemed helpful.

# 8. NEW! Cornerstone Housing for Women, Ottawa:

40" x 60". For 30 years, homeless women have found a home through Cornerstones. Through the staff at the Booth Street residence, we will offer the long and short term residents there a quilt.

#### Q: How fussy are we?

A: We find that, in Ottawa, even needy children can be particular

about what is on their quilt. No flowers on a boys quilt! No old colours on a teen's quilt! This makes it awkward for us, because the fabrics we have donated to us are often floral and dated. As quilters, we know that we can make a beautiful quilt out of anything (right?), but as charitable administrators, we recognize that we have to be careful about giving certain quilts to certain places.

# Q: How can I help you give to children in Ottawa?

A: Give us quilts or donations of fabric with BOY STUFF on it: cars, dinosaurs, dogs, etc.

Give us quilts or donations of

fabric that are unisex: bright, but absolutely no pink. Children, geometrics, stars, etc.

Give us 100 per cent cotton solids/blenders (tone-on-tone): no polycotton broadcloth.




