We want you, our members, to design and make a 4.5×6.5 inch (finish 4×6 inch) block that represents what Canada means to you. Your block can be a vertical or horizontal orientation. Use any technique you like to complete your block.

We will have a table to accept your entries at the guild meetings. The deadline to contribute is October 2016. We'll then put them together to create what should be a very meaningful quilt to all of us. We hope the finished quilt will be part of an exhibit that will travel from quilt show to quilt show in 2017.

We are crazy enough to do it again! Will you join us?

We are counting our inches from Quilt Canada 2015 to Quilt Canada 2016 and are a little late getting started. We really



We're doubling up this month as I missed the March meeting; many thanks to Shirley and everyone who did the work for me. And again, many thanks to everyone who had their own inches written down for me.

For March we had 8,532 for Bring and Brag and 9,120 for Charity quilts for a total of 17,652 inches which is .45 km
For April we had 3,110 for Bring and Brag and 7,176 for Charity quilts for a total of 10,286 inches or .26 kms

Our running total is 83,151 inches which is 2.11 kms (or 1.3 miles) This is enough distance to take us from MIFO to Place d'Orleans Mall and

get us inside so we could get a tea or coffee and discuss quilts with friends.


Rules
