2018 QUILT SHOW UPDATE - VOLUNTEERS, IT'S TIME TO SIGN UP!

Wahoo! Only 1 month until our Quilt Show. I know everyone is busy; cutting, sewing, snipping, reverse sewing, pressing and finishing (OK, I suspect there are some just starting) their quilts to put in the Show. Reminder; Quilt registration deadline is 10 April, 2018. Your quilt does not need to be completely finished by that time, just enough to take a recognizable photo for registration.

To ensure our guild puts on a Great show again this year May 11, 12 & 13 (Mother's Day weekend) we need you to take a moment to check your schedule to see where you can lend a hand and work a shift (2hrs) or more? The sign-up posters will be at the April and May meetings or you can send Janice an email via the quilt show link (CTQG web site).

Types of Volunteer Opportunities:

White Glove Ambassadors: You stroll through the quilt display area, helping the visitors view the quilts, answer questions, hand out programmes, chat with folks and generally be a smiling face from our Guild.

Admissions: Selling entrance tickets, stamping hands and being your helpful selves.

Security: Monitoring one of three emergency exits for illicit activity (i.e. keep the quilts from walking out!). This is a sitting or standing shift.

CTQG Info Table: Promoting our own guild activities and membership.

Members Boutique: Selling quilt items that our own members have for sale.

Set-Up: Thursday, May 10, starting 10:00am. This is all about hanging the quilts up. If you can you hang a curtain, you can hang a quilt (even my husband can do this one). If you can bring a ladder or another buddy (partner, offspring)? All help is appreciated and the more we have the easier & faster the job goes.

Tear-Down: Sunday after the show closes. The quilts get taken down, bagged up and handed back to the quilters. There is a wide variety of tasks from climbing a ladder to sitting, so everyone can help. Once again, the more hands we have for this task the faster it goes.

Why Volunteer? We need you, it's fun, you meet other quilters, you get to see what goes on behind the scenes and you get free admission to the Quilt Show the day you volunteer! Set-up volunteers get to pick their free day! So pick a day, pick a shift and sign up, come on out to the Quilt Show. Help us make this a successful Show for everyone! You must hold a valid membership (2017-2018) in the CTQG to enter your quilts in the show, and only members as of December 31, 2017 are eligible for prizes. Your entry must not have been displayed at a previous CTQG show.

The categories eligible for prizes (voted on by the show attendees) are:

BED QUILTS:

- 1. LARGE: a quilt with a perimeter of 350" or greater
- 2. MEDIUM: a quilt with a perimeter of 349" or less

WALL QUILTS: A quilt that is designed to be hung for decorative purposes. These will be grouped according to the following criteria:

- 3. PIECED: more than 50% pieced
- 4. <u>APPLIQUÉ</u>, <u>MIXED</u> and <u>OTHER TECHNIQUES</u>: more than 50% appliquéd, or using other techniques such as embellishment, embroidery; whole cloth quilts, etc.
- 5. <u>MINIATURE</u>: The quilt must have a perimeter less than 96" total. If blocks are used they must be 4" or less. A bound full-size block is not considered a miniature, neither is a hexie quilt made with pieces ½" or greater. The overall pattern must show a miniaturization of a quilt.
- 6. <u>ART QUILT</u>: The work as a whole must be original in concept, be made primarily of fabric and may incorporate unconventional techniques and embellishments.
- 7. <u>ASSORTED QUILT ITEMS*</u>: Quilted clothing, placemats and runners, pillows, etc. *Two items submitted in this category are considered one entry to the show
- 8. <u>MODERN (NEW)</u>: Modern quilters embrace functionality, simplicity and minimalism. Characteristics might include: use of bold colours and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid colour, improvisational piecing, minimalism, expansive negative space, and alternate grid work.
- 9. <u>CHILDREN'S THEME/CRIB (**NEW**):</u> Intended use would be for a child's room either as a wall hanging or a small bed quilt. All techniques.

Members may enter up to four (4) pieces. Our space is limited, so we may have to limit entries to three. Please indicate on your registration form which quilt you prefer to be withdrawn. All categories must have a minimum of ten (10) items. The committee reserves the right to move an entry to a different category if appropriate.

Please, ENTER your guilts! Your guilts make the show a success!

When you bring items to the drop-off location, bring a picture of your item—to be included with the Members' Market Item Identification & Retrieval Form. If you have more than one item the same, take a picture of 3 or 4 of the items and mark how many you are bringing.

What you need to know:

Only registered items will be accepted for sale at the show.

Sales will be cash only (cheques or credit cards will not be accepted).

The member will establish the 'price' and it will remain as such for the duration of the show.

Prices must be affixed **securely** to each item.

Items must be brought to the drop off location (accompanied by Identification and Retrieval form and pictures) during the week of **April 23 to May 3, 2018.**

The guild will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.

Payment for sold items will be made to you at the close of the quilt show **OR** at the June 12th Guild meeting.

Items not sold must be picked up at the end of the quilt show, May 13th by 4:30 pm at the City View Curling Club, 50 Capilano Drive, Ottawa.

Hello Fellow Quilters:

As many of you have probably heard, Quilt Canada is coming to the EY Centre in Ottawa for June 13 to 15, 2019. Volunteers form the basis of a successful Quilt Canada and we are looking for your support and assistance. We are currently working to have an exciting lineup of classes and lectures booked, led by well known and capable International and national instructors. And preliminary plans in other areas are underway to lay the groundwork for a successful conference.

We are currently recruiting volunteers for the important Team Lead positions. These key volunteers will work closely with the CQA/ACC Conference Coordinator to deliver an amazing event. We are asking for your help in filling the following Team Lead positions:

Workshop Team Lead which will require about 15 hours per month prior to the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Volunteer Team Lead which will require about 15-20 hours per month from October to June and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Merchant Mall Team Lead which requires 2-5 hours per month prior to the Conference month prior to the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Logistics Team Lead requires approximately hours 5 per week for 4-8 weeks prior to the show and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Concurrent Shows Team Lead requires approximately 5 hours a week for two months prior to the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Publicity Team Lead requires approximately 5 hours a week starting 10 months ahead of the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Signage Team Lead requires approximately 5 hours a month, January to June and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Quilt Shows Set-up and Take Down Team Lead requires approximately 4 hours per week for 6-8 weeks prior to the show and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

National Juried Show Coordinator requires approximately 10 hours a week for 3 months prior to the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown. This position is suitable for a team of 2 to undertake.


Mystery Quilt Challenge

Twelve years ago, designers and friends Christine Baker (Fairfield Road Designs) and Nellie Holmes (Originellie's) formed a joint company, Upper Canada Quiltworks Publishing Co. so that they could publish books and patterns that they co-design.

Their first book, Rag Bags©, released in May 2004, was a huge hit and featured patterns for 12 different tote bags all made using

the rag technique. Their second book Rag-a-Muffins© (2005) contains lots of projects to make for children such as rag quilts, fusible appliqué wall hangings and accessories. This year they released their third book "Celebrate Canada" which contains lots of projects using Northcott's "Oh Canada" line of fabric. It is available now in quilt shops across the country. Collectively they have designed over 200 patterns.

They currently have 56 patterns that they have designed jointly for Upper Canada Quiltworks and Northcott Fabrics and have just released their first block of the month quilt pattern called "Tweets and Twinkles". They also design patterns for many major quilt magazines. Christine and Nellie do trunk shows and workshops for quilt guilds and they teach at local quilt shops. They have often been exhibitors at International Quilt Market and Quilt Canada. They both live in Brockville, Ontario.

Nellie Holmes is a quiltmaker, pattern designer, editor, teacher, and author. She spent many years as a field editor for the American Quilters Society and the Quilting Editor for A Needle Pulling Thread magazine. She has done freelance work for numerous magazines. She graduated from St. Lawrence College with a Diploma in Craft and Design and a Certificate in Fibre Arts. She is a Quilting Professional Teacher of the Year Nominee. She was awarded first place in the Trend Tex Challenge for primitive quilting. Nellie has been quilting for over 20 years and has lectured and taught workshops throughout Canada and the USA. She also taught at the professional conference at Quilt Canada. She has organized close to 40 quilt retreats and enjoys sharing her knowledge and her love of quilting with others.






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COMMUNITY PROJECT NEWS




