Dear friends: It's June and here I am, not the VP, but the treasurer elect. It's been an interesting year for me, and the first order of business is the cuddle quilts delivered in May.

Sherrill called it a 'wheelchair night' and was it ever! She mentioned all who came in with mounds of quilts. I know Barb Zabchuk consistently brings 5-6 monthly. Steady as she goes, Barb could easily reach the 1350 goal (whose goal is that?). #### Challenge quilt for the 2018/2019 guild season La

It is my pleasure to give you a sneak preview of the guild's challenge quilt that will start in September. It will be a block challenge with the final quilt to be determined by you. You can do all the 12 inch blocks (13 in total) or make one block many times ... you can make a table runner, a baby quilt, a big quilt, whatever, but in the end it must be a "quilt" to be in the running for the prizes.


Your final quilt will depend on what you do with the blocks; using sashing, borders and/ or setting blocks on point. I will be providing some inspiration regarding these elements as we go along. The fabric requirements are very approximate as each quilter will decide on their preference - scrappy, solids, 2 colours, 3 colours, etc. I have chosen 18 fat quarters and approximately 2 meters of background fabric which will be ample fabric to get all the blocks completed with some left over.

There will be two (2) 12 inch blocks per month (only 1 block in December) from September through March and the instructions will be located on the <u>website under the Guild Activities Tab at the top of the page and a link</u> (just like the newsletter). You can decide to start in September or you can wait and do them at a later date just by clicking on the tab on the website. All the previous month's blocks will all be located there, so you can jump in whenever you want. No signing up, no special emails ... just easy and fun.

Let's see how creative we all can be. I hope some of the blocks will push you out of your comfort zone and that you play with the blocks to make it your own.

Have a great summer and see you all in the fall.

#### Hello Fellow Quilters:

As many of you have probably heard, Quilt Canada is coming to the EY Centre in Ottawa for June 13 to 15, 2019. Volunteers form the basis of a successful Quilt Canada and we are looking for your support and assistance. We are currently working to have an exciting lineup of classes and lectures booked, led by well known and capable International and national instructors. And preliminary plans in other areas are underway to lay the groundwork for a successful conference.

We are currently recruiting volunteers for the important Team Lead positions. These key volunteers will work closely with the CQA/ACC Conference Coordinator to deliver an amazing event. We are asking for your help in filling the following Team Lead positions:

Workshop Team Lead which will require about 15 hours per month prior to the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Volunteer Team Lead which will require about 15-20 hours per month from October to June and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Merchant Mall Team Lead which requires 2-5 hours per month prior to the Conference month prior to the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Logistics Team Lead requires approximately hours 5 per week for 4-8 weeks prior to the show and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Concurrent Shows Team Lead requires approximately 5 hours a week for two months prior to the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Publicity Team Lead requires approximately 5 hours a week starting 10 months ahead of the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Signage Team Lead requires approximately 5 hours a month, January to June and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

Quilt Shows Set-up and Take Down Team Lead requires approximately 4 hours per week for 6-8 weeks prior to the show and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown.

National Juried Show Coordinator requires approximately 10 hours a week for 3 months prior to the Conference and full attendance for all of the days of the Conference, including set-up and takedown. This position is suitable for a team of 2 to undertake.

The show is open to all styles, and past show pieces can be seen on the website.


Deadline for entries is May 31st. There is no theme and there are minimal size constraints.


