Merry Mayhem's Case #120

Note: Drawings are NOT to scale!

Draw an "X" on the wrong side of each of your 5 3/4" LIGHT squares as shown at right.



Combining them at random and using an accurate 1/4" seam on both sides of each diagonal line, sew sets of Light and Dark 5 3/4" squares right sides together so they look like the diagram at left.


(Please note that the squares in the diagram are shown slightly offset so you can see both layers; when actually layering the squares, you will stack them so their raw edges are even all the way around them.)


Next, <u>carefully</u> cut the above units apart in the following manner:

- 1. Cut <u>exactly</u> 2 7/8" in from one side of the square as shown in the first diagram at right.
- 2. Then cut exactly 2 7/8" across the square as shown in the second diagram.
- 3. Finally, cut **ON** each of the diagonal lines you drew. You should now have a total of EIGHT Half-Square Triangle units from each pair of 5 3/4" squares.

Press seam allowances toward your dark fabrics.







Depending upon which size project you are making, you should now have a <u>total</u> of 192 Half-Square Triangle units for the Crib size, (384) for the Lap, [640] for the Twin, OR {1344} for the Super-Queen, in sets of 8; each unit should measure 2 1/2" square from raw edge to raw edge.
