





# YM/YWCA TRY Supportive Housing for Women.

The TRY program provides low cost housing with support for women who are homeless or at risk of being homeless. The women have a private room but share common washrooms and kitchen facilities. Rooms come furnished with a closet, bed frame and small fridge. Clients provide their own mattress, bed sheets, towels, cooking utensils, and groceries. Often these women arrive with only a blanket for their bed. By giving these women quilts we can help keep them warm and hopefully provide some comfort.

What? A monthly Saturday Sew Day, great friends, great space, little work.

**When?** 9am-8pm—the second Saturday every month beginning in October. Mark your calendars and register now!

Where? Centre Notre-Dame- des-Champs Recreation Centre, 3659 Navan Road.

**How?** This is a co-operative effort among participants; minimize work, maximize fun. All you ever needed to know to participate you learned in Kindergarten. All you need to bring with you is a cheerful attitude, your lunch and/or dinner, your sewing projects and supplies, beverages. No liquor licence will be purchased. The cost is \$10 (member) or \$12 (non member). Bring your friends!

**No frills means no frills.** Participants will be responsible for set up and take down of their personal work space. Volunteers will be needed to bring guild sewing supplies (irons, ironing boards, Accuquilt, etc.) from the basement and return same. Access will be given to Guild dishes including kettle but participants must clean their dishes immediately upon use.
