NOVEMBER


Are we having fun? This month we are going to make half the blocks for the last round (because the last round has a lot of blocks). The low road blocks are pieced (and again, not a walk in the park) and the high road blocks are improvisational (improve). You will find the directions for the "low road" and the "high road" under the Guild Activities tab (Challenge Quilt) on the CTQG website.

- Why not shake things up make this month's block from the other road this time. You can choose to make either the high road blocks or the low road blocks or you can make a block of your choice. This month we are making 16 blocks measuring 8" finished 8 1/2" raw. OR
- Get ahead by making the whole round (if you really like the block) make 16 more of the low road blocks or 16 more high road blocks. Or wait to see what the December blocks look like.
- The instructions for all months will remain of the website so that you can jump in at any time.





CTQG 2020 QUILT SHOW: "Stories in Stitches"

I am happy to provide an update on our next quilt show, Stories in Stitches. We have a committee in place and have started in on planning the show. First, a reminder of a couple key points.

- ♦ The show will again take place at the Cityview Curling Club on Capilano Drive. We are hoping to learn from our first show as well as the Ottawa Valley guild's experiences to make this show a great one.
- The show this year will be a <u>two-day</u> show, running Friday May 8th from 10 till 7 and Saturday May 9th from 10 till 5.

I am happy to announce that this year, we will be offering the opportunity for members to have their quilts judged! We have arranged for an apprentice judge to assist in this regard. She will provide written comments on judged quilts. Members may submit any or all of their show quilts for judging. There will be a modest fee of \$10/quilt for these quilts to offset the cost of the honorarium paid to the apprentice judge.

And speaking of quilts, here are the details as to what can be submitted!

Members may submit up to four quilts. In order to take into consideration comments from the last show that quilts were placed too close together, members may submit one quilt in each of the Large Bed, Medium Bed and Modern categories. This limitation should allow us to expand the space in between rows and giving viewers a better opportunity to admire the quilts. Quilts can be submitted in the following categories (dimensions and criteria for each are provided).

- ◆ Large Bed Perimeter of 350" or more
- ◆ Medium Bed Perimeter of 349" or less
- Children's Theme/Crib the intended use would be for a child's room, either as a wall hanging or a small bed quilt. Any technique may be used
- ♦ Wall hanging A quit that is designed to be hung for decorative purposes. New this year there is one category for wall quilts regardless of the technique(s) used
- ♦ **Miniature** Perimeter of 96" or less. If blocks are used, they must be 4" or less. A bound full-sized block is not considered a miniature, nor is a hexie quilt made of pieces of ½" or greater. The overall pattern must show a miniaturization of a quilt.
- ◆ Modern Modern quilters embrace functionality, simplicity and minimalism. Characteristics might include use of bold colours and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid colours, improvisational piecing, minimalism, expansive use of negative space and alternate grid work.
- ◆ Assorted Quilted Items This category includes quilted clothing, placemats and runners, pillows, bags, etc. Note that two items submitted in this category are considered one entry for the show.

Stay tuned for additional information regarding the show, including how to submit your quilts.

Most of you know that the "Community Projects" team collects quilts (cuddle quilts and other quilts) made by the members of this guild. These quilts are dispersed mostly to organizations within our community however we also send quilts further out, some even going abroad.

Most recently Lynn and I have taken over this work from Catherine Parkinson and her team. They have done an amazing job and we are hoping to continue this valuable work. It is truly wonderful to see how great our membership is - this past month (September) Community Projects received 84 cuddle quilts alone!

Perhaps less known, is that we also have many quilt tops waiting to be quilted. We would like to get them out to where they are most needed. In order to do this, Community Projects would like to put forward a Challenge / Contest to our members to get as many of these tops quilted by the end of our guild year.

In order to participate in this Challenge / Contest, you need to:

- a) Pick up a kit at the Community Projects table during our October, November or December guild meetings. Kits will include a top, backing, binding and label),
- b) Return the quilt when it is done, no later than our May 2020 guild meeting,
- c) Your name will be entered for a cash prize drawn at our June 2020 meeting.


