## Cutting Instructions

## Background Fabric

32 - 5 " squares cut in half diagonally (a bit oversized)
16-13/4" squares (center of block)
Dark, Medium and Light Fabrics
$11 / 4$ " random strips totalling approximately 800 inches (you can get approximately 300 inches of $11 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips from a fat quarter and the same from a quarter meter)

## Log Cabin On Point Piecing Instructions

Starting with the $13 / 4$ " background square, make a traditional log cabin block. The log cabin block will measure 6 1/4" (raw).

Sew a background triangle on opposite corners of the log cabin block. And then sew a background triangle on the other 2 opposite corners of the log cabin block (see diagram on the next page).

Trim up the block to 8 1/2". You will need 16 of these.
