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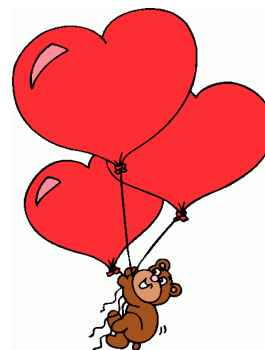
Vice President's Name Tag Draw

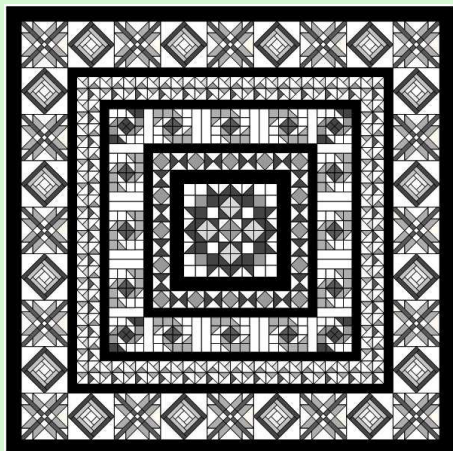
Hello WINTER. I hope all that are working on this quilt are progressing along and enjoying the challenge. Whew - these will be the last of blocks. Next month we will be starting to put it all together. There is still a bit of time to catch up.

This month I will be presenting the blocks for the fourth round. The low road features a twist on the classic pinwheel block and the high road features the equally classic flying geese (goose) block.

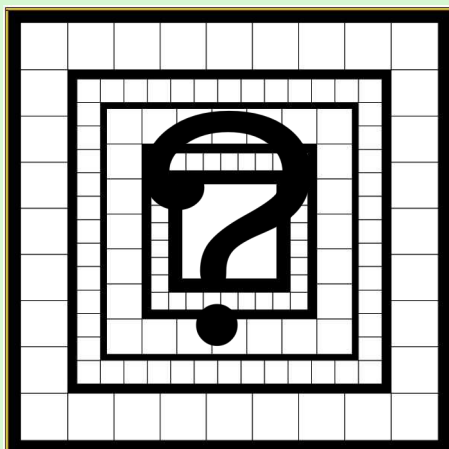
You will find the directions for the "low road" and the "high road" under the Guild Activities tab (Challenge Quilt) on the CTQG website.

- ♦ You can choose to make either the high road blocks or the low road blocks or you can make a block of your choice (same size).
- ♦ For the low road, you will make 48 double pinwheel blocks. Each will measure 4" finished - 4 1/2" raw.
- ♦ For the high road, you will make 96 flying geese blocks. Each goose will measure 4" x 2" finished - 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" raw
- ♦ The instructions for all months will remain of the website so that you can jump in at any time.

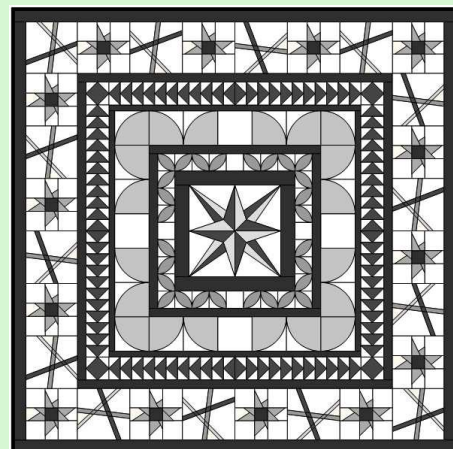
Low Road

Bill Stearman will be returning to teach us how to create his iconic piece. This workshop is being held on Sunday Feb 9 from 9am to 3pm.



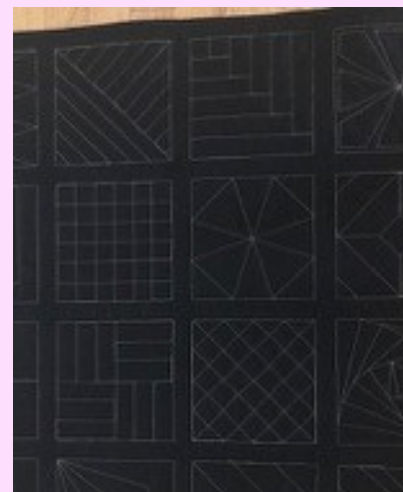

A Daytime quilt guild has started up in Ottawa: the **Wednesday Quilt Guild!**

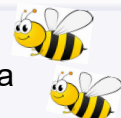

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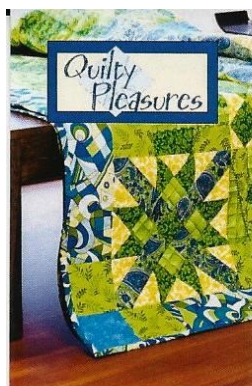
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CTQG 2020 QUILT SHOW: “Stories in Stitches”

January 2019 Quilt Show Update

Your Quilt Show Committee is hard at work, and the show will be here soon—May 8th & 9th. The price for admission will be \$10 for one day, or \$15 for 2 days.

Quilt Show Volunteers Needed! Our show is successful thanks to our many volunteers. Please help us make this year's show a great one. Sign up at guild meetings, starting in February!

I hope you are all working hard on your quilt submissions! The categories can be found on the website.

Judged Component: The Committee has decided to proceed with engaging an apprentice judge for our show. You will have the opportunity to have one or all of your quilts submitted to the show judged. As mentioned previously, there will be a nominal fee of \$10 per quilt to offset the honorarium paid to the judge. There is no requirement to submit any of your quilts for judging, BUT, this is a great opportunity to receive constructive feedback on your work, in a non-threatening way. The judge will provide feedback via e-mail, and will address positive factors of your quilt as well as areas for improvements. There will be no prizes awarded, this is not a competition, but simply an opportunity to learn and improve. Quilts submitted for judging will be identified as “judged”, but all feedback will be confidential. Please think about this, and don't be shy to submit a quilt for judging. I am committing to do so myself! Also, please note that this is providing valuable experience to an apprentice judge who will use this practical experience to support her path to full accreditation.

In case you were wondering about the criteria assessed, the judge may offer comments on any of the following:

1 General appearance

- Overall statement
- Tidy presentation
- Clean
- Threads concealed, where appropriate
- Properly identified (label)
- Hangs as intended

3 Workmanship

- Consistent with design as a whole
- Precision of construction (traditional techniques)
- Borders are straight if intended to lie flat
- Binding is appropriate for the quilt
- Backing is compatible with top, is smooth and wrinkle free, knots are concealed

2 Design

- Overall composition
- Balance
- Rhythm
- Proportion
- Use of colour
- Appropriate choice of material pattern and texture, in keeping with the intended use of the quilt
- Appropriate choice of quilting pattern and material
- Borders/bindings/edges enhance and complement the work
- Suitability of materials as they relate to design and function

There will be a separate registration process for judged quilts, and more information on this will be provided in March. Note that any quilts submitted for judging are to be included in the number of quilts allowed, and are not additional.

Registration: Registration will begin in March, and will close on April 14, 2020, which is a guild meeting. Registration can be done online, in person at a guild meeting or by mail. If registering by mail, your entry must be postmarked no later than April 7, 2020. Forms will be available on-line or in person in March. Stay tuned for more information on registration!

Member boutique: We are once again offering members a chance to offer handmade quilted/fabric items for sale at the show. All proceeds from sales go to member who submitted the items. If you are selling any of your items, you will be asked to share in the effort of operating the boutique. You will be responsible for deciding on the price of your items and dropping off your items at the Cityview Curling rink on Thursday May 7, 2020, in the afternoon. More information, as well as inventory sheets, will be available in March. Start working on your items!
