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## Cutting Instructions

## Flying Geese Block

The fabric cutting for these blocks will depend upon which method you choose and where you put the background fabric and the method will be up to you.

Method \#1 - Stitch and Flip

$$
192=21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \text { squares } \quad 96-41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \text { rectangles }
$$

Method \#2 - Stitch and Flip and Trim

$$
\text { 192-23/4" squares } \quad 96-43 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 4^{\prime \prime} \text { rectrangles }
$$

Method \#3 - No waste 4 at a time

$$
24-51 / 2 \text { " squares } \quad 96-3 " \text { squares }
$$

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## Instructions

Use one of the tutorials listed below or your favorite method for making flying geese. You will need 96 geese units measuring $4 " \times 2$ " finished (4 1/2" $\times 2$ 1/2" raw).

If you want to get a head start on putting blocks together, this would be a good round to start on. The four "sides" are sewn together separately as shown on the following page.
