

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<u>For sale—Pfaff Expression 2.0 Quilting sewing machine</u>

The Pfaff Expression 2.0 has a roomy throat, allowing quilting of quite large quilts with ease. It is well lit and the IDT fee system helps for smooth stitching. There are over 100 stitch programs, over 30 needle positions, and a graphic display. Easy to learn and easy to use, I am selling this machine only because I have bought a Performance machine. Includes the feet shown and a couple dozen bobbins.

It has been tuned regularly and been only one of three machines that I use routinely, so is in very good condition. This machine was on ebay this month for \$899 USD. I am willing to discuss




We are almost done. It is now time to put all those fabulous blocks together into a finished medallion quilt.






