# <u>Virtual Workshop—Foundation Paper Piecing with Freezer Paper</u> November 7, 2020

If you don't like paper piecing this method could very well change your mind! No papers to rip out and very precise seams make this a skill worth learning.

Leanne kicks off this workshop by demonstrating how to create the first few blocks. Then, step by step, you can sew-a-long virtually with her. You should be able to complete a few blocks during the 2 hour workshop and then continue on to make a mini 27"x27", a 54"x54", or 72"x72" quilt. Dig in to your stash and join us to grow your foundation paper piecing skills.







Ever tried speed dating? How about something quick and bold to brighten a March day?

#### Virtual workshop – Speed Date with Improv—March 27, 2021

Think of this class as speed dating with improvisational piecing techniques that include curves and free-cutting. It will be fast-paced and a lot of fun: several techniques are introduced and demonstrated one after the other with very little time to second guess, stress or obsess over perfection. Every student will end up with a unique, original

improv sampler quilt! The focus here is to explore line, shape and happenstance in abstract design, so keep things simply graphic by using solid-coloured fabrics in black, white and one pop of colour. In the afternoon, Krista will share design wall tips to jigsaw the improv elements together, seeking balance and creative design opportunities. *Some pre-cutting is required*.

This Zoom class combines pre-recorded technique videos with live instruction/ support from Krista throughout the class.

# 2020/2021 Common Thread Quilt Guild Challenge: Living through the Pandemic November / Month 2: Pick a Pattern or Design your Own

#### Welcome to month 2, let's take some time to pick a pattern or design your own.

Ok, let's remember our theme – Living through the pandemic and you've just spent some time sorting your scraps. I don't know about you but I found some treasures in the pile. But also scraps the size of fat quarters. What was I thinking?! Now – if you don't have a lot of scraps, now is your time to figure out if you want select a fabric line, use a precut or select some fat quarters and background fabric. Lots of options, but let's talk about pattern or designing your own quilt.

Scrap quilts are a long standing tradition in quilting. Can it be that we want to use every little bit of that expensive fabric? YES! Can it be that we want to use quality clothing that can no longer be mended? Or maybe you want to weave in love from previous quilts and create your own memory quilt. There are many examples of scrap quilts and I have included some links to scrap quilts, you can find many more on Pinterest or simply googling Scrap quilts and looking at images:

#### Now who wants to try designing their own quilt?

I recommend a couple of things to keep handy: graph paper, pencil, quality eraser, coloured pencils & a calculator. When I start thinking about my next project, I dig out the graph paper and start working out my grid. If I am going to make a 6 inch block — I will count out 6 squares each way to make sure I have lots of room to draw out the block. Each square is 1 inch finished. That starts my base and then I draw out the block I want to make — if something hits me then I write out different thoughts on the page. Once I have identified the block — I will then draw out the quilt. Once I am satisfied on design — I dig out the coloured pencils and start colouring.

# 2020/2021 Common Thread Quilt Guild Challenge:

Living through the Pandemic - Month 1: October

....Continued

There are a couple of ways to ease into designing your own work.

<u>Option one</u>: You can pick your favourite block or multiple blocks and make a sampler. You will have to do some quilty math, and don't forget to add a ½ inch to finished block sizes so you don't struggle too much with the challenge. You have choices in the finished sizing of sashing and borders. I am sure you have some books in your library, Pat Sloan's Spendid Sampler or 501 Quilt Blocks: A treasury of patterns of patchwork and applique. Or take a look online: https://www.generations-quilt-patterns.com/12-inch-quilt-block-patterns.html

<u>Option two</u>: Design by dice - Get yourself a die (as in dice) and choose 6 block designs you love. And then choose 6 colours that you want to use (get those scraps out!). Leave your choices up to the random roll of the die. Take a look at the Ottawa Modern quilt guild's presidents challenge for some tips and other links. http://ottawamodernquiltguild.blogspot.com/p/presidents-challenge-2020-2021.html

<u>Option three</u>: Quilt Design a day or QDAD. This year they have a prompt where you select a photo and use that photo as inspiration for your design and you also use the palette to choose your colours. You can find the group on Facebook: https://www.facebook.com/groups/1382986385304572/

<u>Option four</u>: Be bold, shake off the rules and try some improvisational piecing. Take two pieces of fabric – sew them together, cut and grab a third piece of fabric – add it on. You can find inspiration from Gwen Marston or Sherri Lynn Wood or Krista Hennebury.




