February Keynote Presentation

Krista Hennebury



Krista Hennebury describes herself as a geologist by training and a quilter by choice. Quilting was her second-choice hobby after woodworking, but became an obsession half way through her first class. Since 2000, Krista's tried every technique at least once, worked & taught in an LQS, blogged for 10 years, published many magazine patterns and a book (Make It, Take It; 16 cute and clever projects to make with friends, Martingale, 2015), run over 60 day retreats, coordinated Vancouver's first two Modern Quilt Showcases, taught in 7 countries (twice above the Arctic Circle!) and on a cruise ship. She's had one or more quilts juried into QuiltCon and QuiltCanada every year since 2014. Krista makes traditionally- informed modern quilts in her small home studio in North Vancouver, B.C. where she presses seam allowance to the dark side.

Virtual workshop – Seven techniques for Quilting section by section – April 17, 2021

Sign-up deadline – April 6, 2021

Finding it hard to squeeze a big quilt through the opening of your sewing machine but you don't want to pay to have your quilt professionally done? The solution is to quilt section by section and then assemble your quilt. Have no fear! These techniques will make it possible to quilt your own quilt! The Bonus: you will have the satisfaction of completing your quilt from beginning to end.

In this workshop, you will learn the advantages of each of 7 QAYG techniques, how to choose the best technique to achieve the results you want, how to adapt a regular pattern into a Quilt as you go and get stunning results.

At the end of this workshop, you will have made a sample of each of the techniques for future reference.

Virtual workshop – Circles, Circles and Gentle Curves – April 18 and 25, 2021

Sign-up deadline – April 6, 2021

Build/refine your quilter's toolkit of essential skills to include curved piecing and machine applique and inset circles to add interest in your quilting projects.

It all starts with a gentle curve. This minimal waste technique is the warm up for ¼ circles or drunkard path blocks. Whilst many quilters' have drunkard path blocks in their repertoire, the fabric glue technique can increase their accuracy.

Two different techniques for machine sewn circles with no raw edges. The circle technique should "match" the size and application in your project.

"It is the perfect beginners quilt in which we show 13 techniques that Jacqueline uses in all her designs. So if you hesitate to start one of the BeColourful designs, start with this one and you can handle them all!"

This class is ideally suited to those who know paper-piecing but are interested in learning the BeColourful techniques.

Virtual Workshop – Custom Edge to Edge Walking Foot Quilting with Melissa Marginet - October 2, 2021

We have Melissa Marginet coming back to help us quilt those quilts!

Do you dislike burying threads? By quilting from edge to edge you will not have to bury any threads (unless your bobbin runs out or your thread breaks). But just because you are quilting from edge to edge, doesn't mean you are limited to a boring quilt design or following the same pattern throughout the quilt. Join Melissa in this class where you will be quilting a simple pixel quilt by using her Custom Edge to Edge Walking Foot Quilting technique.

You will be required to make a pixel quilt top prior to class, quilt measures 40 inches square. Instructions will be provided to make the quilt. This workshop is based on Melissa's book, [Edge-to-Edge Walking Foot Quilting Designs](#) which is required for the class.

Virtual Workshop – Christmas Twiddling with Jennie Rayment – November 6 or 20, 2021

Jennie was so much fun that we have asked her back. Jennie will take us through the making of reusable Christmas crackers as well as some other folded fabric fancies.





2020/2021 Common Thread Quilt Guild Challenge: Living through the Pandemic

March—Month 6: How to Quilt it?

Ok – next step, quilting! Quilting can make or break a quilt. You know when you look at a quilt and go – wow!? If you have followed along with all the prompts, by now you should have a finished top, and so now you want to start thinking about the quilting. What do you want to add to your quilt to make it a reflection of how you are living through the pandemic?

Whether you have a wall hanging or a full sized bed quilt, think about the purpose of your quilt. That purpose should help determine what you do. It helps drive scale and density of the quilting. Is there a feature from the fabric that you want to add into the quilting? I recall a recent finish where one of the fabric designs had thread unwound from the spool, I was able to echo/pull those curves of the thread into the meander. Or I created shadow images of the pieced squares in the open negative space.

Where do you find your inspiration? I like to look up some amazing quilt photos on Instagram or Pinterest. Try a search of quilting motifs or edge to edge quilting, if you want to do some all over quilting. You can search graffiti quilting and find a mash up of random designs. Have you seen matchstick quilting? Better yet, if you picked a pattern, you can find loads of quilting inspiration of your quilt, just google images of that quilt.

What's another way to get the quilting done? Quilt by cheque! Yes my friends, find yourself a quilter. Sometimes it is nice to just take your quilt top to a professional and get it done. And done is always better than sitting in the closet waiting to be finished.

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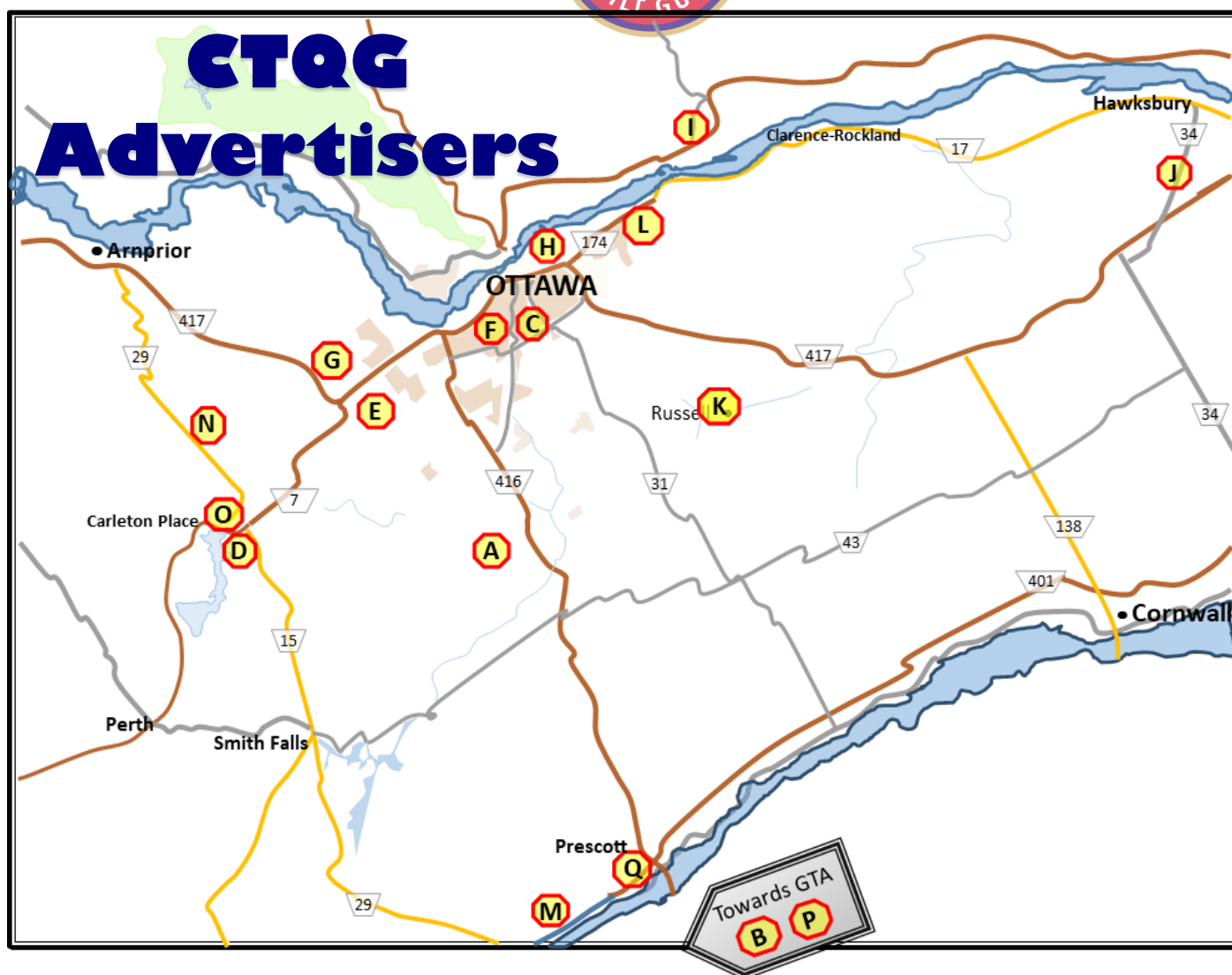
