Marilyn Farquhar is a contemporary quilter. She loves fabric in bold colours and uses both traditional techniques and technology to give her freedom to create original pieces. In January 2020, Marilyn's brother was shot and killed by the RCMP during a mental health crisis (her brother was an advocate for the homeless in British Columbia). She has created a series of quilts entitled Kairos—An Opportune Time For Action--which have helped her to heal during the grieving process. These quilts bring a message that address mental health, grief, changes in policing and hope.

MEMBERSHIP



About Edith Choiniere- Quilter since 1984, oil painting since 1989 and Native craft (raw hide drums, shields, moccasins, mitts, beadwork with or without loom, dream catchers, etc.) since 1993, it's the journey that was given to me to walk. Being in the military, we were posted to Manitoba and that's where I met an amazing Native woman, whom during a three-year period taught me about Native Art and the Spirituality of her ancestors. The mix of three different types of crafts or arts, using fabrics, paint, leather, and beadwork lead me to develop my own unique style that manifests itself in my designs. Always looking for new emerging trends, I love doodles and Zen styles. When I'm looking for a new design for a pattern, I let my intuition and the vibrant fabric colors guide me. I am very inspired by Mandalas and everything that is very different from what we normally have on the market. That is why I chose the name "COLLECTION INÉDITH" which is a play on words with the word "INÉDITE" which, figuratively speaking, means UNIQUE.

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

Lynn Bradley and Maria Fleming

Hi. We are Lynn Bradley and Maria Fleming - co-leads for Community Projects. We are both long time guild members and long time quilters, so we hope to continue to successfully support and manage this important guild activity.

Thanks to members, we were able to donate over **275 quilts**, wheelchair size and larger, and over 350 cuddle quilts to local institutions this past year. Give yourselves a pat on the back and round of applause for all the good we do.

As a reminder, we have both quilting and top piecing kits available at meetings to sign out to complete for us. These are great for when you are between fabric purchases but want to quilt, or to practice new quilting or binding methods on. Sign one out, but please aim to return it within 4 months. There are a number that have been signed out for a long time and we would like to get them gathered back in so they can be completed and distributed to those in need. If your situation has changed and you cannot complete them, please do not hesitate to return them back to Community Projects table...no questions asked.

We also will be happy to accept completed quilts as it means we can deliver more frequently. If you deliver a pieced top, we will try to layer and quilt it quickly, as well. We are always on the lookout for backings to match up with the completed tops if you have spare to donate.

We ask that completed quilts, whether kits or donation, include a Guild label. We have these available at meetings. There are some organizations that haven't received many quilts this year - mostly for children under 5 or up to almost adult 'kids'. So if you are looking for some ideas for new quilts, please consider some for our younger recipients. Teen quilts are also always appreciated. With that in mind, we will also have some appropriate top kits available for sign out.

**To reduce congestion at the table, we will trial using a bin for donated quilt drop off.
Add your name to the bag, or pin to the quilt so we know the donor.**

Over the course of the year we will do a short introduction of the organizations that receive our quilts so they become a little more familiar to you.

As a reminder, quilts of the following sizes are appreciated:

Cuddle quilts - 22" square

Kids quilts from crib to twin - 40" x 40" to 60" x 72" (older teens may be tall)

Adult size, as many have twin beds or larger - 60" x 75" or wider

Wheelchair quilts - 36" x 36" to 36" x 40"

By specific request - 45" x 60"

Sewing at Home – Together!



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
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
