Monika Henry is a modern quilter and pattern designer based near Ottawa, Canada. She's originally from Switzerland and became fascinated with quilts on her first visit to North America as a teenager. That fascination eventually evolved from her first tentative steps in quilt making to designing colourful, modern, and somewhat minimalist quilt patterns. She takes a relaxed approach to quilt making, getting inspiration from everyday items. Her patterns are designed with beginner to



intermediate quilters in mind, to pass on the joy of quilt making and to inspire quilting confidence, one piece at a time

In this trunk show, Monika will take you along on a quilting journey from her first quilt to finding the modern quilt movement and the evolution of her own quilt designs over the years. Along the way, you will take a look behind the scenes of her quilt patterns and see where she gets her ideas and how a design goes from inspiration to published pattern.

Quilt Show Challenge: BLACK AND WHITE PLUS ONE

A guilt with a perimeter of 349" or less, made with black and white fabric (remember that black and white make grey), plus one other colour OR one other fabric. (Maximum of 1 Entry)

(note: I have chosen my pattern, fabric and have it cut out; now I just have to sit down long enough to sew the blocks.)



Make little quilt(s) no bigger than 12" x 12" (fully finished) that says "don't touch the quilts" in a clever, pictorial way. Add a 2" Sleeve, sign and date the back. Hand it in to the Quilt Show table at guild night for your chance at \$\$\$ prizes. See the separate write up in the Newsletter for more details.







COMMUNITY PROJECTS Lynn Bradley and Maria Fleming

Thank you to all who signed out top and quilting kits at the October meeting. The more of these we can get quilted, the sooner we can get them back and into the community. As mentioned last month, we now have links to free patterns by companies supporting our Community Projects use of printed patterns. These are in the Resources/Patterns section of the website. To help those who may be new to machine quilting, or would like some easy quilt ideas, there are also some links to articles or books (of which we have copies in the library) with easy edge to edge quilting. This reduces the need to stop and start, bury threads, or some of the other time consuming aspects of machine quilting just a block at a time.

In the Tips and Tricks tab, there is now a link to just one method of attaching binding completely by machine. Though many like to hand finish binding while watching TV one evening, others may want something that completes a quilt quickly. I know I love getting it done on the machine and lets me move on to other projects. Hopefully these tips will encourage you to sign out some of these kits for practicing your machine techniques.

SPOTLIGHT ON: Hospice Care of Ottawa

Hospice Care of Ottawa is a service provided at no charge to individuals with life limiting illnesses and their families. They provide emotional and social support to individuals through Community Programs, such as Day Hospice and In -Home Support. Residential Hospices provide 24-hour care. There are currently two with a third location in Orleans being developed. Bereavement Care in the forms of retreats, gatherings, support walking groups or drop-in groups is also available to those who are coping with a loss.

Recently we received an email of thanks from the Director of Community Services. An excerpt is here.

Please let your quilters know that their quilts will be given to individuals in the Ottawa community who are journeying through a life limiting illness. We visit every client who is appropriately referred to us and bring with us a "Comfort Kit" full of practical and enjoyable items, with the highlight of the kit often being a beautiful quilt.

The feedback about receiving a gift of a quilt has been overwhelmingly positive here are just a few highlights:

- client cried said she was moved and that it gave her hope
- client and wife loved the kit; wife asked how to donate to Hospice
- He was so happy to receive something like that
- She was very touched
- Was stunned that the quilt matched the colours in her bedroom
- People love the quilt. Often our clients spend a lot of time resting and find the blanket useful

Please share this feedback with your quilters, and how Hospice Care Ottawa is so happy

to be the distributers of such a gift. Thank you!








QUILTERS RECYCLING TABLE




