## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE—For the Love of Quilting—Diane Grover

St. Valentine's Day makes February the month of roses, chocolate and romance. Indeed, a quick trip to the quilt shop or glance at a magazine will dazzle you with seasonal red and pink fabrics decked out in hearts and cupids, all symbolizing love. The Ancient Greeks had many different words for love, as they understood its different contexts. These expressions of love included filias (brotherly love), agape (love for humanity) and eros (romantic love).



Quilting too has its own love language. First, there is the love of the fabrics that we buy. We ogle the colours, stroke the bolts longingly and drool at the printed designs, especially the new digitally printed fabrics that are so vibrant and clear. Cyndi's first book, Fun With Panels, C&T Publishing was released in fall 2022. Cyndi's passion for quilt making is evident in comments from her students and in her never-ending quest to find new techniques and skills to share so that quilting is a fun, enjoyable life-long endeavor.



## Special Editorial—Part Three



#### Slash Your Stash - Part Three

How is your fabric stash looking now? Have you been sewing or crafting using your quilting cottons? If you still have plenty of yardage sitting on a shelf, then check out these ideas for using

up your fabric so that it can be seen and enjoyed.



- 12. Girl's Dress. Perhaps one of the easiest dresses to make involves fashioning a skirt from two panels sewn together widthwise, then gathered along the long edge. Sew this skirt to the bottom of a T-shirt (either as is or after cutting off the T-shirt's hem) and then hem the skirt. You can also sew an accent pocket onto the T-shirt with any extra yardage. Bonus points if you match the dress to a quilt!
- 13. Covered Boxes. Whether it's cardboard magazine holders, shoe boxes or any other type of paper/cardboard box, all you need are fabric, scissors and some glue (spray adhesive and white glue or a glue gun).
- 14. Lined Bookshelves. This idea works best for solid colours, subdued tones or stripes. Measure the back (vertical) wall of each shelf and cut a piece of foamboard the same size. Cover the foamboard with your fabric, wrapping it around the edges and securing on the back of the foamboard. Insert the board snugly against the back of the shelf. Repeat with remaining shelves. This quick change can make a dramatic difference to your room and highlight the shelf's contents or else add a subtle hint of colour to complement your home.



- 15. Crocheted Rag Rugs. You may not want to use good yardage for this project but if you have some "ugly" fabric, yardage that's been in your stash for so many years you don't remember when you bought it or maybe even inherited someone else's stash, this idea might be for you. Cut the yardage into 1" strips (ripping the strips is often easier than cutting). To connect the strips, cut a small slash in the end of two strips, loop one end through the other and tighten. Repeat until you have "yarn". Using a large crochet hook and single crochet stitch, make a fabric circle to your desired size. The fabric will fray, giving these rugs a rustic charm.
- 16. Crocheted Baskets. Similar to rag rugs, adjust your stitching to make round basket shapes. Commercial patterns may be helpful but these can also be made using basic crochet knowledge and some experimentation. You may want to adjust the size of strip, crochet hook and your tension to achieve your desired result.
- 17. Basket Liners. I have a variety of oversized wicker baskets, wire and plastic mesh containers throughout my house in which I store magazines, craft supplies, and electronics accessories. Sometimes smaller items fall out

though. That's why I've started making liners that fold down over the outside of the baskets and keep everything inside. While most are a neutral tone and work in any room of the house, I'd like to make some using my quilting fabric to better coordinate and add some colour.

Here's hoping you are all settled into the winter routine of snuggling up under a warm quilt, or quilting something new for you or others. Your efforts contributed to yet another successful delivery day. Here they are, ready to go!

SPOTLIGHT ON: Interval House

Providing a safe place for women to create their future.

Interval House is a 38-bed shelter for women and children. When it opened in 1976, it was Ottawa's first shelter for women fleeing abuse. In its first 40 years, it served more than 3200 women and 4000 dependents in their shelter, and countless others through their crisis line and programs. As well as housing, they offer support and advice prior to leaving an abusive situation, as well as during and after. This includes pet housing, counselling services, peer counselling and child and youth services. They collaborate with several other city organizations.



Quilts received from us find their way to the shelter and stay with the women as they find their own homes.

As a reminder, quilts of the following sizes are appreciated:

Cuddle quilts - 22" square

Kids quilts - from crib to twin - 40" x 40" to 60" x 72" (older teens may be tall)

Adult quilts - twin (60" x 72") to queen

Wheelchair quilts - 36" x 36" to 36" x 40"

## **ACCUQUILT GO! - Super Speedy Tool!**

Those who attended the January retreats saw a demonstration by Shirley MacFadden on how to use the Guild's Accuquilt Go! Cutter. The cutter and all of the dies were set up in the main sewing area and all had the opportunity to see the many dies available and to start thinking about future projects that could be enhanced – in speed and accuracy of cutting – with this versatile tool.



For those who missed it, Shirley will give a demo at the March 9, 2024 Sew Day (Notre Dame des Champs Community Center NDC CC). The cutter and dies the Guild has purchased are available to the members during all In-Person Sew Days and Retreats. Members are free to drop by and cut their fabric during this times and are not obliged to pay for the Sew Day or Retreat if they don't intend to stay.

Please check out the complete list of dies as well as handy tips for using the cutter at <a href="https://commonthreadquiltguild.ca/resources/accuquilt-fabric-cutter/">https://commonthreadquiltguild.ca/resources/accuquilt-fabric-cutter/</a>. While the listing is currently in text only, we will be adding pictures to the descriptions in the coming weeks. Note also, that the Accuquilt website has a wealth of information about all of their dies.

There have been a couple of queries about whether or not Guild members who have their own Accuguilt Cutter can borrow dies. This has been considered, as have other options for increasing accessibility to this tool. It is hoped that Guild members can plan projects that make use of the AccuQuilt that align with Sew Days and Retreats. All of the dies need to be available at all Sew Days and Retreats, so that members can plan ahead what fabric they wish to cut using which dies, in full confidence that the dies will be available to them. Loaning them out would be unwieldy, in terms of ensuring their return to the NDC CC by the next Sew Day/Retreat, and would entail a currently impractical burden in signing dies in/out with accompanying financial deposits for these expensive items.

While you're thinking about which dies you may wish to use at the next Sew Day or Retreat, check out the free patterns available from Accuquilt (remembering, of course, that the Guild does not have all of the dies). <a href="https://www.accuquilt.com/patterns/free-quilt-patterns.html">https://www.accuquilt.com/patterns/free-quilt-patterns.html</a>

Get your creative juices flowing, jump on the computer (Pinterest) for ideas and make one, two or <u>more</u> NO TOUCH QUILTS. Multiples of the same quilt are welcome as we need many on display to help us let 2024 CTQC Quilt Show visitors know that there is to be no touching of the quilts.

**Creative freedom is yours!** Piece it, applique it, the technique choice is yours! Chance at a cash prize! Total cash prizes of \$100.

For every MINI QUILT you make, you will be entered in a cash draw. The more you make, the more chances you have to win! The deadline is April 9, 2024 (guild night). On the plus side, you will have a quilt in the show!!

**How to do the lettering?** A common question. A few suggestions; Wide satin stitch, cut out the letters and iron on or applique on, perhaps you know someone with an embroidery unit, or a Cricut cutter?

## **2024 QUILT SHOW CATEGORIES!**

Entry rules and registration forms will be available on the guild website in March, 2024. Entry deadline is the May guild meeting (Tuesday, May 14, 2024).



You must hold a valid membership (2023-2024) in the CTQG to enter your quilts in the show and be eligible for prizes. Your entry must not have been displayed at a previous CTQG show.

The show categories are:


#### **QUILTS:**

- 1. LARGE: a quilt with a perimeter of 350" or greater (Maximum of 1 Entry)
- 2. MEDIUM: a quilt with a perimeter of 181" 349" (Maximum of 1 Entry)
- 3. SMALL: a guilt with a perimeter of 180" or less
- 4. MINIATURE: a guilt with a perimeter less than 96" total. If blocks are used they must be 4" or less. A bound fullsize block is not considered a miniature, neither is a hexie quilt made with pieces ½" or greater. The overall pattern MUST show a miniaturization of a quilt.
- 5. ASSORTED QUILT ITEMS: Quilted clothing, bags, pillows, etc.
- 6. BLACK & WHITE PLUS ONE CHALLENGE: a guilt with a perimeter of 349" or less, made with black and white fabric (remember that black and white make grey), plus one other colour OR one other fabric (Maximum of 1 Entry)

## **SPECIAL EXHIBIT:**

YOUTH: There are two categories for youth to show their quilting skills:

- a) youth 13 years and under
- b) youth between 14 and 17 years.





Members may submit up to five quilts. Depending upon the number and size of the quilts entered, entries may be limited to three. Please indicate on your registration form which quilt(s) you prefer to be withdrawn, if necessary.

We hope to have a display of workshop and guild challenge quilts. This display will be from workshops and challenges presented since the May 2022 quilt show, and the quilts hung here will not be voted upon, nor included in the show limit of quilts.

The committee reserves the right to move an entry to a different category if appropriate.


